At this time of year you will be thinking about leaving primary school and taking the next exciting step to secondary education. To assist in your decision making, I should like to invite you to our Open Evening at John Kyrle on Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> October.

The school will be open from 6.00pm until 9.00pm and you will be able to see our facilities, buildings and resources. They include £1m Art Studios and an exclusive Sixth Form Centre. Over the past few years we have opened a Music Technology Suite, two Science data-logging labs, and an innovative Learning Centre (the WyeLearn). The school restaurant has been refurbished and extended and the cashless system we operate is very successful. We have opened our new £1.25m *Centre of Excellence* for Mathematics, given our success in this subject and its popularity, including at A-Level. We have also recently refurbished the English department to include a Literacy Resource Centre, a Library and a Computer Suite.

Sports facilities at school have been enhanced with our extensive Multi-Purpose Games pitches. We opened a new building in October 2013 which houses a large multi-gym, together with geography and RE classroom facilities and a Conference Centre. In the summer of 2017 we fully refurbished our PE changing rooms.

The school received a visit from Ofsted inspectors in March 2017. Our gradings of 'Outstanding' for Leadership & Management, Student Behaviour & Safeguarding and the Sixth Form were upheld. Ofsted noted,

- 'Pupils are well behaved, polite and friendly'
- 'Because of excellent attitudes to learning and strong academic results, pupils are very well prepared for life after school'
- 'Parents value the education that the school provides'
- 'Staff are proud to work at the school.'

In a letter to me following the inspection, one of Her Majesty's Inspectors wrote, "You are effective in your aims to develop young people who are 'happy, healthy and successful'."

My focus continues to be on providing the best learning opportunities for young people. My staff, trustees and I want high academic standards and a full range of exciting extra-curricular activities for all. In the summer of 2016 and 2017 we, once again, achieved outstanding excellent results at GCSE and A level. In both sets of examinations we were significantly above local and national averages. The success at GCSE came from all subject areas, including English, maths, science, computing, PE, business studies and technology. We are the most successful provider of Sixth Form education in the region, including schools and colleges. This is evidenced by the large number of higher grades of A\*-B that our students attain, and our being placed consistently in the top 5%-10% of post-16 organisations across the UK by ALPS (A-Level Performance System), a nationally-recognised, independent body.



Please feel free to visit us at any time between 6pm and 9pm, on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> October. There will be a formal session at 7.00pm in the Main Hall with a talk from myself, Assistant Headteacher and Head of Lower School, Trixie Clarke and Hayley Knapper who will be Head of Year 7 for the academic year 2017/2018. There will also be student perspectives from current Year 7 and Sixth Form students.

Refreshments will be served in our Restaurant throughout the evening. Staff will also be available to advise on transport arrangements.

In addition to the formal element of the evening, you will be able to sample the all-important 'atmosphere' of the school. I am certain that you will find it to be a friendly and welcoming one. We are a successful, award-winning and inclusive school, continually oversubscribed in all year groups. As Ofsted noted we are effective in our aim for students to be *Happy, Healthy and Successful*.

Current students will be available to give 'consumer points of view' during our Open Evening. There will be displays, demonstrations and 'hands-on' exhibits. The subject areas represented will include:
